JHS Teachers and Principals focus expands on *Visible Learning*

JHS teachers and principals are continuing to implement the principles of *Visible Learning*. In his book, *Visible Learning for Teachers: Maximizing Impact on Learning,* author John Hattie outlines years of research in which a statistical analysis of "effect sizes" are used to determine optimal growth for student achievement, as a result of strategies used by teachers in the classroom.

JHS Principals have recently conducted "learning walks" in which they have reviewed in classrooms whether the fundamentals of *Visible Learning* are in place. This process will help the principals and teacher leaders craft professional development activities for this summer and next school year.

Areas of focus for every classroom are: 1) all learning intentions (course objectives) are posted in every classroom every day, 2) all success criteria (understanding of how the

JHS is preparing for Accreditation Visit for March 2016 by AdvancED

Joplin High School is organizing teams to review progress towards meeting accreditation standards set by AdvancED/North Central for an upcoming accreditation review slated for March 2nd and 3rd during the 2015-16 school year.

The AdvancED standards measure a school's effectiveness in the areas of: vision and purpose, governance and leadership, teaching and learning, resources and support systems, and commitment to continuous improvement. The JHS teams will be pouring through documents and examine survey data in a "self reflection" activity to assess how well Joplin High School meets the standards in the coming months. The standards set by AdvancED help schools measure their effectiveness in meeting researched based "Quality Schools" standards.

Joplin High School has been affiliated with the North Central Association (which is now part of AdvancED) since 1915. On March 2nd and 3rd, 2016 AdvancED will send a visiting team to JHS to review practices, interview staff, students, parents, and community members. The visiting "quality assurance review" team will leave the school with a preliminary report of their findings. Schools use the preliminary findings as well as the final draft from the quality assurance review team's final report to help launch further school improvement measures.
